WORKING IN BIG CITIES



In the city, many jobs do not require special skills or a higher level of education. However, you will often have to pass interviews involving a certain command of English, especially if you are in contact with customers.

HOUSEKEEPING

Housekeeping involves cleaning homes, hotels, hostels, shopping centres, or offices. These jobs are often part time (from 20 to 25 hours per week) and pay at around \$25 per hour. You can also clean your hostel (several hours per day), and have free accommodation in return. The equipment is generally provided.

HOSPITALITY

Bars, hotels, cafés and restaurants employ a large number of backpackers,

especially in the peak season (December/January). However, there is also a lot of demand from backpackers for this type of work, so try and arrive early in the season to be able to find a job easily. You can work as a waiter or waitress, a kitchen hand, do the dishes or work on the bar. You can also work in cafés as barista or cafés attendant. All these jobs are paid around \$25 per hour (more during weekends). Remember that in Australia, you need a certificate for all jobs where you serve alcohol.

The RSA certificate (Responsible Service of Alcohol) can be obtained by completing a day of training about Australian legislation, and you have to pay for this yourself. Budget \$100 to get your certificate.

For anyone who wants to work in coffee shops, the barista job is for you. In Australia, making a coffee is an art! Most cafes will require you to have experience before hiring you as a barista and the majority of them will require you to take or have taken some barista training. During this training, you will learn how to handle the machines to prepare all kinds of coffees served in cafes and restaurants in Australian cities. RETAIL AND SUPERMARKETS

There are a lot of jobs available in shops, such as fast food restaurants, clothes shops, and all kinds of small independent shops. Many retail stores, especially in larger shopping centers, look for casual sales assistants. Pay rates are between \$24 and \$26 (better pay at the weekend).

Supermarkets offer a large volume of jobs all year round, but cashier and shelf-stacking jobs are often already taken by Australian students. Pay rates are around \$23/hour (higher on weekends and

public holidays).

DELIVERIES / DRIVER

If you are looking for flexibility, driver or delivery jobs are a good opportunity to earn some money. All you need is an ABN, a smartphone, a vehicle or bicycle and good insurance.

If you have a car, you can work as a driver for Uber, Didi or Ola companies in Australia. Also consider UberEats for takeout delivery.

If you have a bike, UberEats and Deliveroo also offer bike delivery jobs.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN

Working as an Au Pair can be a good opportunity to combine work and Australian experience. You will be paid around \$300/week, housed and fed by your host family. In exchange you will have to take care of the children. You usually need to commit for several months with the family. A nanny job is another option, the difference being that you don't live with the family.

also consider going to schools or leisure centers (vacation care), which sometimes need supervisors or facilitators.

To work with children, you will need to have a WWCC (Working With Children Check) for NSW as well as a First Aid Certificate.

FACTORY, SLAUGHTERHOUSE

Factory jobs are available to everyone. These are generally food factories (fish, seafood, meat, etc.). Working conditions are often difficult (cold, long hours, smell etc). However, fluency in English is not essential. Salaries range from \$23 to \$25 per hour.

You can also find jobs in slaughterhouses, sensitive souls abstain. These jobs are tough, both physically and mentally, but the salaries are better.

CONSTRUCTION

For those willing to do physical work, there are often short-term labour jobs available in construction, landscaping, removals. These jobs are well paid and there is high demand for workers.

To find work in this area it is recommended to go via agencies specialized in this area.

To be hired in this field, you must have the White Card. It is a compulsory certificate for all staff (supervisors, employees, etc.) who work on a construction site. The White Card certifies that you have undergone training and that you know and apply the safety rules on construction sites. On construction sites, you can find jobs as laborer, cleaner, traffic controller or even more specialized trades (electrician, plumber, paver, carpenter, etc.).

OTHER TYPES OF CASUAL JOBS

Many other casual jobs are available in most Australian cities. If you are having difficulty finding a job, broaden your search to less sought-after positions (caravan park maintenance, gardening, jobs in golf courses, administration and office support, babysitting, etc.).

Also remember to take a tour of the industrial areas of large cities, car washes and vehicle rental companies are often looking for labor throughout the year. You can do cleaning jobs there, clean cars, move vehicles, etc.

CERTIFICATES & TRAININGS



TO WORK in some sectors you will have to get compulsory trainings. For example, if you want to work in an establishment where alcohol is served, you will need the RSA. If you want to work with children, you will need to show a clean criminal record, first aid training etc. Here is everything you need to know about the mandatory training depending on the jobs you are applying for.

HOSPITALITY

If you want to apply for a job in a restaurant, pub, bottle shop, hotel, you will need to get a RSA certificate (Responsible Service of Alcohol). Compulsory in all states, this diploma is obtained through training and allows you to work in all places where alcohol is served or sold.

RSA

- The certificate is only recognized in the state where it was obtained.
- 3-4 hour training, either online or in a training centre.
- Prices range from \$50 to \$150 depending on the state.

RCG OR RSG

The RCG (Responsible Certificate of Gambling) for the state of NSW or RSG (Responsible Service of Gambling) for the other states, is a certificate allowing you to work in the betting and gambling professions. For example, you can work in casinos, racetracks, pubs, etc.

BAR / COFFEE SHOP

Other training allows you to develop your skills in service / catering. Making cocktails, coffees etc. For example, if you want to work in a coffee shop, you can train as a barista. Count around \$200 for this. The training lasts a whole day and you will learn how to handle the machines, to prepare all kinds of coffee.

There are also bartender/maid training courses to learn how to make cocktails, serve them, etc. An advantage for those who wish to make their place in these different fields.

WHITE CARD

To work in construction or in the mines in Australia, it is mandatory to have the White card. It certifies that you know and apply the safety rules on construction sites.

FORKLIFT LICENSE

- Training to learn to drive a forklift truck.
- Recognized in all states
- On site training for 1 to 2 days
- Prices start from \$200

BLUE CARD, WWCC

If you plan to work with children, you will need to obtain a Blue Card for QLD or equivalent in another state (WWCC for NSW for example). This is also the case if you want to work in the education or health sector with children. To check which card/certificate is required, check the regulations of the state where you intend to work.

The card costs around \$100, rates vary by state. In general, this card is valid for 2 years.

OTHER USEFUL TRAINING

Being a traffic controller is not a difficult job and is well paid. The Traffic Controller Course gives you the skills and practical knowledge needed to regulate traffic on the roads.

If you work in construction, factories, warehousing and agriculture. It's imperative that you take a course on working at height, whatever the height at which you work.

JOBS FOR THE MOST QUALIFIED



HEALTHCARE is lacking in workers and offers numerous opportunities for those with qualifications. Hospitals often use specialised interim agencies for temporary contracts. Nurses in particular are in demand in Australia. However, you do need to register as a nurse in each of the states you wish to work, and obtain an equivalence. These jobs can also lead to sponsorships.

FINANCE AND ACCOUNTING SECTORS offer jobs for those with specific skills and qualifications along with business attire (accounting, bookkeeping, financial analysis, etc).

WEB AND NEW TECHNOLOGIES Workers skilled in new technologies are also very much in demand in big cities. The IT sector often offers contract of freelance positions. Roles can range from software development, IT support, web design, to digital marketing.

Foreign workers qualified in **CONSTRUCTION AND ENGINEERING** are also highly appreciated, but you do need to obtain recognition from the TRA (Trade Recognition Australia) and a Green Card (NSW, WA), Red Card (VIC) or Blue Card (QLD).

LEGAL SERVICES

Lawyers specialising in key practice areas such as banking and finance; corporate, commercial, construction; IT, telecoms and commercial litigation are usually in demand.

EDUCATION AND TEACHING

Backpackers with a background in education might find opportunities as substitute teachers, language instructors. For teaching in schools, appropriate qualifications and a criminal check are typically required. Teaching English as a Second Language or English as a Foreign Language positions are also available in language schools.

MARKETING AND COMMUNICATION

There are opportunities if you have experience in marketing, public relations, communications, especially in contract or project-based roles. Digital marketing and social media skills are particularly in demand.

HOW TO FIND A JOB IN TOWN



IF you intend to look for a job in a town, here is some advice to avoid making common errors. Of course there are many ways to identify opportunities, and the best method is to use them all! However, sometimes you need to be patient because the job search may take several weeks. Stay motivated, keep making an effort, and in particular, meet people, let them know you are looking for a job. Word of mouth is always effective in Australia! It can be a good idea to go further out of very competitive town centres. There are so many jobs in suburban areas usually well-connected with public transport.

PREPARE YOUR RESUME

As for all countries, a CV is an essential part of the job search in Australia. However, depending on the types of jobs you want to do in the country, your CV will be different. First of all, a resume in Australia is often longer and more detailed than you might be used to. Resumes in Western Europe are usually kept to two pages, whereas an Australian resume can easily go up to five or even seven pages for a specialised job. So don't hesitate to be specific about your experience and personal qualities.

You will also need to tailor your CV to the position you are applying for! This may seem logical, but consider presenting your experience differently depending on the job you are applying for. Some tasks, responsibilities or skills will be more relevant than others.

PREFER FACE-TO-FACE CONTACT

If you are looking for a job with a direct contact with a clientele (hotel, restaurant, sales): present yourself directly to the company you are interested in. Australians appreciate direct contact. Be smiling, ask about the company, ask if it is possible to meet the manager. Show that you are open-minded and accessible. Also in construction and on farms, do not hesitate to go directly to the building sites or to the farms.

RECRUITMENT AGENCIES

Very common in large towns, these agencies are very popular. You may need to go there every day to consult the new job offers as soon as they are put up. It will usually be mandatory to

register in their database and provide a CV.

Most common agencies are Hays, Manpower, Drake International, Addeco, Kelly Services, IPA Personnel, Hudson.

JOBS IN FRUIT PICKING



FRUIT PICKING is a general term that covers all agricultural work. Some of these jobs are ideal for those who want to work short or medium term to finance their trip. They are very popular with Working Holiday Visa makers because they do not require any particular skills and there are many jobs available across the continent. Each Australian state has a wide range of fruit and vegetables to harvest at different times throughout the year.

These jobs are an opportunity to meet Australians from all states as well as backpackers from all over the world.

Usually the work is arduous testing your levels of physical fitness. You will sometimes be working bent down to the ground or on a ladder holding up your arms. The work is often repetitive and tiring.

JOBS TYPES

PICKING

Picking is the number one type of job in agricultural work. But there are different types of picking. You can collect fruit or vegetables, from the ground or from trees, in very different working conditions. Some fruits are easier to pick than others. For example, cherries have the reputation for being easy to pick and well-paid. On the other hand, tomatoes and onions generally have a bad reputation

Apples are easy once you get the hang of picking them quickly and often. The picking is selective. As soon as you have picked them, you put them in the bag around your waist and later empty it into the bin. For the first few days it is normal to have aching shoulders! Be gentle in your movements because some types of apples are easily

damaged and the farmer will often examine the quality of the fruit that has been picked.

Oranges are quick to pick once you have mastered the « twist » (twist your wrist to pick them without taking off any skin). You can pick using bags or buckets depending on the farms. Strawberries give you backache (collected at ground level).

Vegetables are also collected from the ground and so put your back to the test!

Generally, your experience of picking will depend on the farmers, their way of working and the overall atmosphere. Give yourself a few days before making up your mind.

Picking from trees often involves using ladders which can make the task more complicated.

On the other hand, if you have back problems, picking on the ground can be painful. Try to find the type of picking which will suit you best.

Selective picking involves choosing the fruit or vegetable to pick according to its size, colour or both. The farmer will no doubt show you samples of what should be picked. This involves smaller quantities than massive picking and so will have an influence on your payment if you are paid according to how much you collect.

Bulk picking involves collecting more or less all the fruit produced by the

tree. You only take out damaged fruit. Easier than selective picking, this type of picking usually happens at the end of the harvest season.

PACKING

This involves sorting and packing fruit and vegetables. The working conditions are similar to factories. The environment is often noisy and the task completed in a production line. These jobs may also be paid according to the quantity you sort or pack. Expect that you will need a few days to get up to speed.

PRUNING

Cutting back trees or vines using pruning shears. These jobs, often well paid, need a good level of physical fitness. They are usually carried out in winter in difficult weather conditions. Pruning shears can be electric or manual depending on the region and the type of pruning. Pruning can be paid according to how much you get done, or paid by the hour, depending on the type of trees. Manual pruning shears require repeated effort from your hands and can be painful to start with.

THINNING

Thinning out tree fruits before the harvest season. You pick the smallest fruits so that the others have space to grow big. The farmer will show you what size fruits to leave. Thinning needs a certain amount of patience and a sharp eye.

PLANTING

Planting varies enormously according



to the fruit or vegetables concerned. It is often done manually, but use of machines (tractors) is occasionally necessary for the biggest trees. To plant young trees you will need to use a pick and shovel on a daily basis!

HOW TO FIND A JOB?

Every year thousands of travellers cross the continent are looking for work in the agricultural sector. There are several ways to find a job, but the best bet is always to use them all to increase your chances.

OVER THE PHONE

Use the contacts in this guidebook: **PAGE 50.**

This will enable you to contact the farms directly and ask if they need fruit pickers, so you don't have to cover a lot of kilometres with no guarantee of finding work. When you contact them, use the opportunity to find out about

the local fruit picking situation this year.

Even if the answer is negative, ask some questions, as the information can be valuable.

DOOR TO DOOR

Door to door is one of the best ways to find a fruit picking job. Farmers appreciate meeting you before giving you a job and it is easier to make a good impression compared to the phone. Visit farms during working hours so you are more likely to find someone on the property.

If not, remember to prepare a small note (surname, first name, reason for your visit, telephone number, etc.) to slip into the letterbox.

However, you should be aware that going door-to-door in these sometimes isolated farming areas can be time-consuming and involve financial costs, which can sometimes be considerable (fuel consumption). What's more, this type of search is only feasible if you have your own vehicle. Farming areas are not well served, so it's difficult to use public transport.

WORD OF MOUTH

Don't hesitate to talk to people you meet. In the pub, on the beach, in a park, during a visit... talk to the locals. They can be invaluable in your job search. Australians are altruistic and won't hesitate to lend you a hand if they can. Talk to other backpackers you meet in hostels, tourist attractions and supermarkets. They'll be able to share their job tips with you or give you some good advice to make your search easier.

BACKPACKERS HOSTEL

Go to the backpackers to consult the classifieds board. Sometimes you can give your name at the reception to be put on a list of people looking for a job in the region. But if you are not "guests" of the hostel, the chances of results are lower!

WORKING BACKPACKERS HOSTEL

Some youth hostels (located in agricultural areas) offer to find you picking work. This can be convenient but there are no guarantees: the wait can be long depending on the seasons, and some people take advantage to a certain extent.

GOVERNMENT WEBSITE

The Australian government has created WorkForce Australia, where you'll find a list of job offers in harvesting by state. You can click on the jobs that interest you and apply directly.

CENTRELINK

CentreLink is a state service centralizing job offers by sector and geographical area. They have offices in most towns and you can consult job offers free of charge on the computers made available to the public.

CONTRACTORS

In some towns, farmers work with independent recruiters. When you go to see them on their farm, they will say to you “for recruitment we use...”.

If this happens a few times you will need to contact this agent to try and find work in the town.

OTHER IDEAS

Agencies can be found in all towns. The best known to backpackers are Madec (www.madec.edu.au) and Skill Hire (www.skillhire.com.au). Also, look for ads in supermarkets or the local newspapers (some free of charge).

WORKING CONDITIONS

Working in agriculture requires you to be in good physical condition. Most fruit-picking jobs will be in difficult weather conditions. Nevertheless, this type of work is accessible for most people. You don’t need to be sporty. Girls do very well as they are more agile than men in some tasks.



Everyone can find their niche in this kind of job, as long as they have willpower and courage.

WORKING HOURS

When the harvest season comes around, it's common for bosses to ask their employees to be extremely productive. This is perfectly normal. You may be asked to work 6 days a week for 10 hours a day, sometimes more, sometimes less.

Often, because of the heat, you'll start early in the morning. On rare occasions, some farmers will even let you choose your own working hours. If you want to arrive an hour later in the morning or leave an hour earlier at the end of the day, that's possible, as is the case if you don't want to work at the weekend. This option is a disadvantage for you because you won't be earning any money. We advise you to work as much as you can to put as much money aside as possible so that you can continue your road trip in the best possible conditions and as fast as possible as these will all count towards your days for your renewed visa. All the more so when you consider that agricultural regions are often far from tourist areas. Just remember that it's a 'blessing in disguise' over a given period, and that you'll make up for it later.

ACCOMMODATION

Caravans, tents or rooms may be offered to pickers for a symbolic amount. If this is not the case, the best solution is to live in caravan parks or backpacker hostels nearby, or to bring

your campervan to the property.

Some farms provide kitchens and laundry (washing machines and dryers) for their employees. Find out in advance about the facilities on the farm and how much you will be charged.

SALARIES

Pay rates vary according to the farms and the different types of jobs. They can be paid weekly, by the hour, or by production (per basket, per tree, per punnet....)

Employers pay pickers every week or every 2 weeks.

In any case, make sure you are earning the legal minimum wage. Each sector of activity is governed by a collective agreement called Award. It is this Award that defines the minimum rate of remuneration, according to the level of qualification in each sector. These pay rates may be higher than the national minimum wage.

If the company does not belong to any Award, the national minimum wage applies. Since July 2023, the national minimum wage is \$23.23 per hour.

Also pieceworkers are guaranteed a minimum hourly wage. As a result, all full-time and part-time workers (Planting, picking, sorting and packing fruit and vegetables) must receive a minimum wage of at least \$22.61 (since July 2023).

ADVICE TO WORKERS

WHILE YOU ARE SEARCHING

You need to be organized to find a job in Australia. First of all, organize where you will stay according to the seasons and your budget. Start looking, or at least listening out for opportunities, before you need to work!

Call farms directly, and if they don't have any work on offer, ask them questions: When are you going to start the harvest? How's the season this year? All this information can orient you in your job search. Talk to other backpackers, who can also give you information on the regions they have already crossed.

ADEQUATE CLOTHING

You'll need gumboots, a hat, a pair of gloves, trousers and preferably long-sleeved T-shirts to protect you from insects, tree scratches and sunburn. A hat is essential in summer, as it covers your neck, forehead and face. You can also take sun cream and sunglasses with you. A rain jacket can also be useful (sometimes they are provided by your employers), as working in the rain is not at all pleasant. Remember to take plenty of water with you (several litres a day) as well as a fly net (and repellent) if you find it necessary. If you've come to Australia without any equipment, we recommend cheap shops such as Vinnies or Salvos to kit yourself out. Alternatively, try second-hand shops, where you'll find everything you need without breaking the bank.

ONCE ON THE FARM

- Pick with both hands

- independently – it's a lot faster!
- When picking in trees, start from the top and work your way down little by little so you do not have to carry a full bucket or bag when you climb up.
- Avoid damaging the fruit, most farms with check the quality of the fruit you collect.
- Avoid moving around unnecessarily. Pick methodically, from zone to zone.
- Don't overload yourself! Look after your back... You need to stay the course.
- Try to develop an effective picking technique suited to your task
- Careful about where you put your buckets of fruit.
- If you are in a couple try to develop a technique where you to pick together even more effectively than alone...
- Help each other out!
- Go for it and give all you can the first day, and then later find your speed so that you can hang in there for days/ weeks.

BEFORE YOU GO

Do you best to receive all payment for every day you worked before you leave. Make sure you obtain a payslip for your tax declarations, in case of a disagreement, or for information such as ABN, tax paid (mandatory for your Tax Return).

If your employer doesn't pay you and refuses to pay you even when you have spoken to him about it, do not hesitate to contact Fairwork at www.fairwork.gov.au

Fruit Picking



Before Australia, I had never set foot on a farm, today I almost finished my 88 days on the farm! I had lots of different jobs but mainly it was fruit picking. And it's clearly not easy! With the Australian heat or the cold morning in the fields, climbing the trees, I picked cherries, tomatoes, lemons, raspberries, oranges and I harvested! The best part of this experience are the moments you spend with your team, the encounters and the bonds you forge in the farm. And if I had to do it again, I would do it again without hesitation!

WORKING IN FARMS



FARM JOBS

Farm jobs are mostly found in rural areas far from big cities, in the outback. The majority of jobs on farms are picking, packing, livestock farming, cereal or cotton growing, fishing, etc.

For Working Holiday makers who wish to renew their visa to stay for another year, it is necessary to work for three months in a rural area in the country. To consult the eligible post codes,

OTHER JOBS ON FARMS

Even though Fruit Picking is a very popular agricultural activity because it requires a lot of seasonal labor, there are plenty of other farm jobs in Australia. It is thus possible to work in contact with animals or to be an

agricultural worker in a cereal farm.

SOLAR FARMS

For some time Australia has invested in solar farm projects. These are large farms whose activity is to produce electricity through solar panels. These farms are located in remote areas and labor for maintenance or installation is sought after and well paid. Salaries are around \$30 to \$35 per hour + bonuses.

You will be paid more on weekends and holidays. Expect physical and long days. Often 10 hours a day, 7 days a week. The main activity being to install the panels on a large flat ground. You may also be required to clean them etc. You will generally work in pairs.

You will need the White Card to

work in a solar farm. It will also be necessary to have safety equipment (protective helmet, reflective jacket, safety boots, glasses, etc.).

CATTLE STATIONS

Working on a cattle station offers a unique experience that combines hard work with the adventure of living in some of the country's most remote and beautiful landscapes. These vast properties require a diverse range of tasks to be performed, from mustering cattle on horseback or motorbikes, to fence repair, and general station maintenance. Workers on cattle stations might include station hands, stockmen (with experience), cooks, and sometimes roles related to tourism activities on stations that welcome visitors.

WORKING IN MINES



WHAT KIND OF JOBS?

In general, the profiles sought in this field are rather engineers, technicians and machine operators. Mining sites are gigantic in Australia, creating sort of completely autonomous mini towns. In order to meet the needs of the community, many other positions are also available. You can find jobs as cleaners, cooks, housekeepers, etc. (All rounder utility)

WORKING CONDITIONS

Working in mines often involves difficult working conditions. Most mining regions are located in very hot and arid areas (sometimes over 45°C). Working hours are often long and weekends are rare. Here we work

rather several weeks without rest, then 1 week off. Isolation can also put some people off, because you won't find anything hundreds of miles away!

GET YOUR TRAINING

Get the White Card which will show that you already know the safety rules. If you have other diplomas in the field, put them forward (driving machinery, forklift etc..).

FIND CONTACTS

If you manage to meet someone who already works in a mine, it can help you a lot. The network is very important in Australia, and particularly in this fairly closed environment. He will be able to explain to you how he

was able to integrate the mine, and possibly give you a contact.

CONTACT RECRUITMENT AGENCIES

Recruitment agencies will undoubtedly be your main gateway. On the other hand, if you do not have any particular experience, do not waste too much time with specialized mining agencies because your CV will not catch their attention. Instead, turn to “Regional Work” agencies. For the Perth area, you can also take a look at the Sunday newspaper classifieds.



Being there is always an advantage when applying. If offers become available, it will always be first come first served.

MAINTENANCE PERIODS

During certain periods, the mines are closed, or rather under renovation. They can then recruit unskilled labor for shorter missions. It is also a good way to get a first experience in this field

WORKING AS AN AU PAIR



BEING AN AU PAIR

Being an au pair, or how to live with the locals, learn the culture, while earning money.

Being an Au pair is an exchange of good practices. You take care of the children of the family, do some household chores, in exchange for a room, food and weekly pocket money. Families will generally ask you to stay for several months, but it is also possible to find families for only a few weeks.

Driving license is a plus, but usually not required.

HOW TO FIND A HOST FAMILY

You must ask yourself a few questions before looking for a family. Ask yourself in which city you want to live, if you can take care of young children, teenagers. How many children can you handle?

Living with a family that is not yours can be awkward and stressful, so do not hesitate to discuss several times with the families to find the one that suits you best.

FIND ADS

There are several options for finding a host family. For example, you can decide to search for yourself on the Facebook Pages of the city where you want to live (Aupair in Melbourne, in Sydney etc).

You can also contact a specialized agency to find the family who will be ready to welcome you (agency fees to be expected). There are of course other means such as free but very popular specialized websites.

For agencies, you will need to provide some documents for your file. For example a police check, proof of your health insurance etc. You will need to provide information about yourself, your past experiences, what you are looking for in your future family. Beyond that, you will be put in touch with families who meet your expectations.

You can also go through the site Aupairworld. All you have to do is create your profile and the site will find families compatible with you. The next step is to exchange messages and/or Facetime (very important!) to get to know the family and their expectations.

ADVANTAGES OF BEING AN AU PAIR

- You do not have to pay rent (very important since cost of living in Australia is high)
- You don't pay for food
- You will have your private room (with personal or shared bathroom depending on the family)
- Week-ends are usually free, so you can explore
- You receive pocket money each week (amount will depend on the number of hours worked, number of children etc.)
- You can study at the same time or have a casual job in a café.

- If the children are at school, you usually have free time during school hours
- The family will share their life with you and make you discover the culture and the country in an authentic way.

WORKING HOURS AND SALARY

The hours worked will depend on the family and their schedule. Generally you work between 20h and 40h per week.

The days start around 7:00 to 9:00 in the morning: waking up the children, preparing lunchboxes and breakfasts, and driving them to school. You will then usually have to do some household chores. Then it resumes around 3:30 to 6:30 p.m.: picking up the children from school, doing homework with them, cooking dinner and waiting for the parents to return. That is about 5 hours per day.

The rest of the day and evenings, you are often free to do what you want (sport, outing, etc.). You will generally be free on weekends unless specifically agreed with the family. Sometimes they will ask you to babysit in the evenings or weekends but this will be in addition to your pocket money.

The average salary for an Au Pair is \$350 per week but of course it will depend on the number of children, the hours and household chores requested.



VISA

The best Visa option to the Au Pair status is the Working Holiday Visa (subclasses 417 / 462). This will allow you to stay with your host family for at least 6 months. The WHV will allow you to stay 1 year in Australia (you can renew it twice under conditions).

INSURANCE

If you decide to become an Au pair, it is necessary to have private insurance that will cover you in the event of a health problem or in the event that you injure one of the family members or damage their property. We recommend you to take out an au

pair insurance policy that combines health insurance, accident insurance, liability insurance, emergency assistance etc. This way you are sure to be covered in all situations. If you don't know where to start, we advise you to check our partner cover with their special au pair insurance policy.



Cattle Station



I knew from the start that I wanted to have a real outback experience and work in a cattle station. It was a little girl's dream to live the real cowboy life! And I was not disappointed. It's a very tough job physically, we're isolated and it's not always easy for a girl, but I've had incredible experiences. Like chasing wild camels in a 4wd in the desert or herding herds in the outback with helicopters! In addition, it saves a lot of money because we are housed and fed, so no expense. I put away \$24,000 in 5 months of work. If you want a 100% Australian experience, go for it!

OXOXOXOX

WORKING IN SKI RESORTS



Do you want to work in an Australian ski resort? Each winter, the resorts recruit many seasonal workers. This is an opportunity to discover Australia differently!

SEASON

The season usually runs from June to October, with the peak of the season being July to September.

COST

It is generally very expensive to ski in Australia and many Australians travel abroad (especially to New Zealand) because accommodation and skiing are cheaper there.

In Australia, the Ski Lifts pass can

range from around \$90 to \$150 per day, depending on your age, the resort and whether it is peak season or not. It's a bit cheaper for a multi-day pass. If you work in the station, your pass is free.

JOBS

Just like seaside resorts, ski resorts recruit a large number of seasonal workers in hospitality every year because many Resorts and restaurants welcome skiers there.

Shops are also hiring a lot, especially supermarkets but also stores for renting materials, equipment, etc. Many spas and beauty centers also hire beauty therapists, masseuses...

The resort also hires winter sports instructors and a whole range of staff necessary for the operation of the resort: reception of tourists, maintenance of the slopes, smooth running of the lifts, etc.

WHV makers with qualifications in the field of health are also sought after, because some accidents take place each year, not to mention seasonal flues....

SKI RESORTS

The main stations are located around the Victorian border and New South Wales. There are also a few ski areas in Tasmania.

NEW SOUTH WALES

The main stations are Thredbo, Perisher, Charlotte Pass, Selwyn, Jindabyne, Cooma and Adaminaby.

Thredbo is one of the biggest resorts and one of the most expensive. There are many types of accommodation, plenty of restaurants and bars in the village, and a whole range of services. Thredbo has 14 lifts and over 50 runs, the longest being 5km. The resort is a 5.5-hour drive from Sydney or Melbourne

Perisher is made up of several areas including Perisher Valley, Smiggins Holes, Guthega and Blue Cow. All of these villages combined make Perisher the largest resort in Australia. Perisher has 47 lifts and over 100 runs,

the longest being 4km. It is located 5.5-hour drive from Sydney

Charlotte Pass is the highest resort, but also the smallest with 5 lifts and around 20 ski runs, the longest being 0.5km.

VICTORIA

Mount Buller, Falls Creek, Mont Hotham, Bright.

Mont Buller is located in the High Country, a 3.5-hour drive from Melbourne. It has over 30 bars, cafes and restaurants, 7000 accommodations and a wide range of facilities and services. It has 22 ski lifts and over 100 km of slopes, the longest being 2.5 km.

TASMANIA

The two main stations are Ben Lomond and Mount Mawson.

Ben Lomond is a small resort. You can rent skis and boards there, and enjoy its unique café. The resort also has a ski school. It is located on the second highest peak in Tasmania in the magnificent Ben Lomond National Park, just 1 hour from Launceston in the north of the state.


Mount Mawson is located in the south of the island. It is a small station with volunteers working there. You cannot rent equipment there. Passes are \$45 for the day.

Warning!

Work in a ski resort is not eligible for the 88 days of farm work. So it doesn't count if you want to extend your Working Holiday VISA!



Koala



The Koala is a mammal of the marsupial family that lives exclusively in Australia. The koala is arboreal and only eats the leaves of certain species of eucalyptus. It can live an average of 10 years for males and 15 years for females. Koalas can sleep up to 20 hours a day due to their low diet. Previously widespread in Australia, they have unfortunately disappeared from certain regions. The population is estimated at 80,000.



WORKING AS A FREELANCE



IF you want to work on your own, you can work as a Sole Trader. You can then sell your products or services, and declare your income at the end of the tax year. On the other hand, you will not be able to hire staff (but you have the right to have subcontractors, suppliers).

REQUIREMENTS

To work as a freelance, you must hold a valid work visa (WHV, Partner visa, Sponsor, etc). Be aware that this status does not entitle you to a visa!

If you intend to engage in self-employed activity in Australia, you must apply for an ABN (Australian Business Number) in addition to your TFN (Tax File Number). For a reminder, a TFN is a unique and personal 9-digit number that is essential if you want to work in Australia (regardless of your visa).

GETTING AN ABN

For those who intend to be self-employed, it is necessary to obtain an ABN that will identify you to Australian administrations.

The ABN The ABN application is done online and is completely free. It is done via the Australian government

website. You will need to complete a series of questions to make sure your activity is eligible for an ABN. If it is, you will get your ABN straight away. A digital document will be issued to you, and you will receive a hard copy within 28 days.

When working under an ABN, you must pay your taxes yourself at the end of the tax year. If you worked both as an employee and self-employed (with your ABN) during the tax year (from July 1 to June 30), you will have to declare all your income in the same tax declaration, at same time.

As a self-employed person, you will be paid a gross amount by your client and it is then your responsibility to pay your taxes. It is important to put money aside to pay your taxes at the end of the fiscal year.

VOLUNTEERING IN HELPX & WWOOF



VOLUNTARY WORK is unpaid and takes place in small to medium-sized farms. For your work your hosts will provide accommodation and food. The main advantage is working with some very interesting, kind employers, and being able to live close to nature. The work they will give you varies depending on the farm, the region, and the time of year. You may end up doing all kinds of jobs like cutting wood, looking after animals, gardening, collecting fruit or vegetables, planting....etc.

You must meet certain criteria to be able to do voluntary work:

- You must be at least 18 years of age
- You must sign up for the voluntary work program
- You must have a good enough level of physical fitness to be able to do farm work You will be required to work 4-6 hours a day on average.

There are several programs of voluntary work. The best known are Wwoofing, HelpExchange and WorkAway..

WOOFING

The Wwoof (Willing Workers on Organic Farms) program was born in England in 1972. Having been very successful, it has spread worldwide, and today there are nearly 50 countries participating in this program based on mutual aid.

Formerly reserved for farms, Wwoofing now intervenes within families, bed & breakfasts, hotels... Appearing in Australia in 1981, it is now very developed with young people of all nationalities wishing to have a volunteer experience.

To be a wwoofer you will need to be a member. Registration is for 2 years and costs \$70 (per person). You need to do it online on:

www.wwoof.com.au

In return for your registration, you will have access to all the contact details of the participating hosts, a membership card and access to the mobile application.

HELP EXCHANGE OR HELPX

This program is referenced exclusively online. It lists all the farms, ranches, bed & breakfasts or hotels ready to receive volunteer workers in exchange for accommodation and meals.

There are two levels of registration:

- Free registration by completing an online form. It allows you to see some hosts participating in the program but you cannot contact them.
- Premium registration: allows access to all the hosts registered in the program, with contact details.

Registration price: 20€ (for one or two people). You will have access to all online contacts: www.helpx.net

WORKAWAY

Workaway is a popular platform that operates on a simple yet effective model: volunteers offer their skills and labor in exchange for food, accommodation, and an opportunity to learn about the local culture and lifestyle. In Australia, opportunities are diverse, ranging from helping out on organic farms and homestays to assisting in hostels or community projects.



VOLUNTEERING



BY BECOMING A VOLUNTEER for an association, you volunteer your time to help protect or clean up Australia's wildlife. Some associations offer accommodation and food in exchange for a small contribution. It's a good way to make yourself useful and give your time for a good cause, because between land and sea pollution and bush fires, the Australian fauna and flora are in great need of being preserved!

PAPERWORK



ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES are quite simple in Australia. However, they deserve to be well understood in order to declare your income correctly and not lose money.

TAX FILE NUMBER (TFN)

First of all, you will need a TFN to work in Australia. A TFN is a unique and personal 9-digit number. This number allows you to be registered with the Australian Tax Office (ATO).

It is important to get your TFN before you start working in Australia. The TFN application is a mandatory step if you plan to work in Australia. If you do not complete this step, you will be taxed at the maximum rate (47%). But don't worry, when you start a job, you still have 28 days to provide your Tax File Number to your employer.

To get your TFN you need to apply online on the Australian Tax Office website. The process is free and must be done from Australia. You will therefore not be able to make your request from UK or a foreign country.

Following your request, you will receive a reference number that you can use while waiting to receive your final TFN. Your TFN will be sent to you within 28 days, to the postal address

indicated during your application.

TAX FILE NUMBER DECLARATION

When you start a new job, you need to complete a form called "Tax file number declaration" in addition to an optional job contract. Information required includes your TFN, an address in Australia (give the address of your employer, hotel or caravan park), and your fiscal status (resident or not). This form is then sent to the tax office by your employer.

TAX RETURN

When you work in Australia, you must pay taxes to the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Throughout the year, tax is taken directly off your salary before it is paid to you.

The % tax paid depends on your fiscal status (resident or not).

The majority of backpackers with a working holiday visa (or work and holiday) are considered as non-resident for tax purposes. A fixed rate of 15% is applied (from 0 to 45,000

AUD earned in fiscal year).

The only exception to this is if you are both:

- an Australian resident for tax purposes and
- from a non-discrimination article (NDA) country ((Chile, Finland, Japan, Norway, Turkey, the UK, Germany or Israel).

If in doubt, you can do the test “Are you a resident?” on the ATO website:

FOREIGN RESIDENTS

From 0 to \$120 000: 32,5 cents per dollar received

From \$120,001 – \$180,000: \$39,000 plus 37 cents for each \$1 over \$120,000.

RESIDENTS

From 0 to \$18 200: no tax

From 18 201 à \$45 000: 19c for each \$1 over \$18,200

From \$45 001 à \$120 000: \$5,092 plus 32.5c for each \$1 over \$45,000.

There is a SIMPLE TAX CALCULATOR, which you can use to calculate the approximate amount of tax you will pay. Available on this website www.ato.gov.au

Backpackers on a WHV have a special status which must be declared by your employer. Companies must register as employers of working holiday makers by completing a specific form. Make sure that your employer is registering you as a working holiday visa maker otherwise you will be taxed 32.5% (foreign resident rate).

WHEN TO COMPLETE MY TAX RETURN?

In Australia, the fiscal year starts on 1st July and ends on 30th June the following year. When the tax year ends, it is mandatory to complete a form declaring your total revenue for the year: a TAX RETURN. You have from 1st July to 31st October at the



latest to complete and send back your Tax Return.

If your visa comes to an end before the fiscal year-end, or if you plan to leave the country before the end of your visa, you can complete a Tax Return in advance: Follow the steps explained on the ATO website: ADVANCE DECLARATION.

If you have already left Australia, you need to order the current paper version of the tax declaration for the current year over the internet. (They will post a copy to you.)

Complete it, and then cross out the year and write the next year instead. For example, cross out 2024 and replace it with 2023.

Your request may take around 6 weeks.

HOW TO DECLARE MY INCOME?

You have 2 options:

COMPLETE YOUR TAX DECLARATION YOURSELF

- Online declaration via E-Tax (software on the ATO website). Just download E-Tax and install it on your computer. You will need to create an account and link it to your bank, your TFN. You can then complete your declaration and obtain a tax estimate at the end of it.
- On paper, you can order the paper form on the internet: www.ato.gov.au/About-ATO/Contact-us/Order-publications or over the phone: 1300 720 092.

If you have trouble filling it out, know that you can also go to an ATO office to get help from the staff.

Several documents are required to complete your tax return:

- Your Tax File Number
- Your payment summaries (provided by your employer)
- ABN of your employer(s). If you don't have them you can do a search here: www.abr.business.gov.au
- Your bank details (account name, number)

In case your employer(s) did not provide you with a payment summary, you can find the necessary information on your last payslip.

USEFUL TIP: In the DEDUCTION section, you can declare some expenses such as gasoline spent at your workplace, or equipment purchased (picking gloves, safety shoes, for example). You can also declare training/certificates passed in Australia such as RSA, RSG, White Card. Be aware that up to \$300, there is no control from the ATO.

For the **MEDICARE** part, if you do not benefit from Medicare, you are exempt from paying for it. You must complete a Medicare Levy Exemption Form, downloadable from the ATO website to confirm the exemption.

USE A TAX AGENT

If you do not feel comfortable doing it yourself, do not panic. You can hire a tax agent who will go through the process for you. If you have any doubts, your status is not entirely clear or in-between, or that you have large sums to potentially recover, it may be a good way to not take risks.

SUPERANNUATION

The superannuation is a contribution towards retirement. It must be paid in addition to your salary by your employer to a contribution fund (the one that you have opened or that your employer has opened for you). It must be paid by the employer to employees over 18.

Its amount is set at 11% of your salary, which still represents a significant sum over the entire stay. It is important to note that this contribution must be paid on top of your salary. It is not deducted from your salary. So if your employer gives you an hourly rate of \$23/hour, the superannuation contribution must be added to this amount.

You can recover the money paid when your visa expires and when you leave the country permanently.

When you withdraw your superannuation it is taxed 65% (for all temporary visitors).

GET YOUR MONEY BACK

To get your superannuation contributions back, you can complete an online request form on the ATO

website in the « SUPER » section.” You will need to complete a form online: “Application for a departing Australia superannuation payment”.

Provide the following information:

- Your TFN
- Names, member numbers and addresses of your superfunds
- Information about your employers (name, address...)

If you have several superannuation “accounts”, you should combine them before applying for your payment. There are forms for merging your accounts on the website of superannuation companies.

Also be aware that some banks such as Westpac or NAB offer superannuation accounts (this makes it easier to manage your various accounts because everything is grouped with the same bank). You can therefore open your super account at the same time as your bank account and can access it from your Westpac customer account.

YOUR RIGHTS AS AN EMPLOYEE



STARTING A NEW JOB can be an exciting but also a bit stressful. Although every workplace is different, certain rights and responsibilities apply to all employees and employers in Australia.

TO AVOID THE ABUSE of unscrupulous employers towards young foreign workers, let us recall some labor rights and rules in Australia:

- The legal working time in Australia is 38 hours per week.
- Annual paid leave is 4 weeks + 1 additional week for certain shift workers
- Parental leave can be up to 12 months renewable once, unpaid
- All employees working in Australia are entitled to a minimum wage

FOR MOST EMPLOYEES, this minimum wage is set by an agreement (an award) that concerns their sector of activity or their profession. For each Award, there is therefore a minimum rate of remuneration and different rights. You can consult the FairWork website to find out your Award. For employees not covered by an Award, the national minimum wage applies: \$23.23 per hour or \$882.80 for a standard 38 h work week (until July 2024). The National Minimum Wage is

reviewed each year.

NOTE Depending on the type of contract, the rate of remuneration may vary. This is particularly the case for casual jobs. For this type of job, the number of hours you will work per week is not guaranteed. To compensate, you benefit from an increased hourly rate to cover job insecurity (absence of paid leave, sick leave, etc.).

Finally, for those who work in fruit picking and who work by piece. Since 2022, workers are guaranteed a minimum hourly wage. This change applies to full-time, part-time and casual employees. For the horticulture sector, for all full-time and part-time workers, the minimum wage is at least \$22.61 (since 1 July 2023). For casual workers, they must earn at least \$28.26 (since 1 July 2023).

Employers have to pay employees for all work they do. This includes for:

- training
- meetings
- mandatory work activities.

YOUR EMPLOYER DIDN'T PAY YOU?

If you're having trouble getting paid by an employer, follow these steps.

First, send the employer a "demand letter" for unpaid wages. Keep a copy and send it by registered mail, in order to have proof. In the letter, include the date, the hours you worked, your position, and the amount you are owed.

If you do not get a response, contact Fair Work. You can do it online: www.fairwork.gov.au/contact-us/online-enquiries

Specify that you have sent your employer a letter of formal notice but that you have not received a response from him. Keep the registered mail receipt and provide a copy to Fair Work as proof. This could help your claim and provide proof that you have done everything you can to resolve the situation.



Waitress in Sydney



After a 4WD road trip across Australia, I decided to work in Sydney to discover this city that has always attracted me. So I worked as a waitress for 4 months in a restaurant overlooking the Harbor Bridge: an ideal location. The working conditions and the team were great: I was able to share my experience with people from all over the world with whom I am still in contact. This allowed me to put money aside to finance the rest of my trip: I was earning between \$1200 and \$1400 per week. In short, an unforgettable and very rewarding experience!



WHAT TO DO AFTER A WORKING HOLIDAY



2ND AND 3RD WHV

You can apply for a second and third WHV conferring the same rights and allowing you to stay two additional years in Australia.

For Uk passport holders, a visa may be granted for up to 3 years without the need to undertake farm work from 1 July 2024.

REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible, you must still meet the same conditions as for the original visa (age, valid passport, health requirements, no dependant children).

The additional condition is that you must have worked for at least 3

months (88 days in total) in regional Australia. The 3 months or 88 days include weekends if you are working full time. For the Australian government, fruit picking jobs are classed as full time positions (even if they are often casual), and so the weekends are included in the count of 88 days.

You can either work in one block with the same employer or in separate blocks with one employer or a number of employers. Days of work may be in different kinds of specified work. For example, you can complete 60 days of harvest work, travel for a month and complete another month in a construction job to get your 88 days.

For a third year, you will need to complete 6 months of work when on your second year.

ELIGIBLE TYPES OF EMPLOYMENT

Attention, not all types of employment enable you to renew your WHV.

Among those eligible:

- agricultural work such as picking, pruning, harvesting, looking after animals etc. in regional Australia
- working in a mine
- fishing, pearling
- construction
- bushfire and Natural disaster recovery work in eligible areas
- tourism and hospitality in northern or remote and very remote Australia
- Critical COVID-19 work in the healthcare and medical sectors (all Australia)

ELIGIBLES AREAS

A geographical condition must also be met. As a general rule, areas around major cities are excluded (except around Perth and Adelaide). Rural regions are accepted as well as certain regions affected by bush fires. To find out all the regions accepted for renewal, [CLICK HERE](#) or see **ANNEX 08**.

APPLY FOR YOUR 2ND OR 3RD YEAR

You can make the request online whether you are abroad or inside Australia.

If you are applying from Australia, the application must be made before your

first visa expires. Your 2nd WHV will automatically take effect when the first ends. This allows you to spend two years in a row in Australia with the same rights. If your visa ends during the renewal procedure, you will receive a temporary visa ('bridging visa'), until your request has been fully approved.

To apply, go to the Australian immigration website, on the Second Working Holiday visa page. Then click on Apply and it will send you back to your immiaccount. From there, you can directly apply online. You will need to answer a form and provide the ABN number of the employer(s) you have worked for and whose companies allow you to be eligible to renew your WHV.

If you are applying outside Australia, the procedure is the same. Your second WHV will work like the first. You will have one year to return to Australia and your visa will be activated upon your arrival in the country.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

When you apply, you will be asked to provide proof of your work. You will therefore need to provide the ABNs of the employers you have worked for. These employers must be located in the areas eligible for renewal. We advise you to attach as much proof of your work as possible when applying. This includes your payslips, bank statements etc. Be aware that the government may ask you to provide additional documents.



PROCESSING TIME

Processing time can vary from an application to another. Some applications are granted within a few hours others are investigated and can take up to 2 months. When lodging your application for a second year visa, you should upload all your supporting evidence at the same time to avoid delay in processing your application.

For a 3rd year, the process is the same. You need to apply online, from or outside Australia. The fees are the same for all years.

FEES

Cost of a 2nd or 3rd WHV are \$635 (as at Feb 2024).

TOURIST VISA

Getting a tourist visa can also be a solution to stay a little longer after your WHV! You can apply from the immigration website, whether you are IN or OUT of Australia. There are

different types of tourist visas.

EVISITOR VISA (SUBCLASS 651)

This tourist visa allows you to stay a maximum of 3 months in Australia. It is a free visa and application is done online on the immigration website. The request can only be made OUTSIDE Australia (this can be from a neighboring country such as Thailand etc). Once the visa has been accepted, it will take effect upon acceptance and will therefore cancel your current visa. The processing time for this visa is generally quick (24 hours).

Note: this visa allows you to enter Australia for up to three months during each visit during the 12 months from the date the eVisitor is granted.

ELECTRONIC TRAVEL AUTHORITY, ETA (SUBCLASS 601)

This visa allows you to visit Australia as many times as you want, for up to a

year and stay up to three months.

To apply for an Electronic Travel Authority, you must be outside Australia and be a passport holder of a certain country (UK, Germany, Republic of Ireland, Sweden, The Netherlands etc.).

You can apply for an ETA online at Electronic Travel Authority if you hold a passport from: Brunei, Canada, Hong Kong, Japan, Malaysia, Singapore, South Korea, United States.

If your country of origin is not eligible for an application online, you can apply with a travel agent, airline or specialist service provider.

You will need to pay a service fee of \$20 for an ETA. Average processing time is less than one day..

VISITOR VISA (SUBCLASS 600)

For those who wish to stay longer than 3 months. This temporary stay visa allows you to stay in Australia for

3 to 12 months. You can apply online FROM Australia or OUTSIDE Australia.

The price will be different depending on whether you are in the country (from \$380) or outside (\$190). If you are in Australia, be aware that once your tourist visa has been granted, it will take effect upon acceptance and will therefore cancel your current visa. If you are applying for a visa from Australia, you must stay in Australia pending the government's decision.

If you apply for a Visitor Visa (Sub 600) after a WHV, the visa will cost you more. Indeed, in addition to the \$380 requested, a 'Subsequent Temporary Application Charge' of \$700 will be applied to you (if request made from Australian territory).

For a visa application of 6 months or more, you may be asked to provide certain supporting documents such as proof of your financial capacity or proof of your health insurance for this period.



GETTING A SPONSOR VISA TSS



If you would like to work in Australia without applying to immigrate permanently, sponsoring is a good option. You need to find a company who will employ you and agree to sponsor you. You will receive a “long stay temporary business visa” allowing you to live and work in Australia for 2 to 4 years.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

In practice, you will need to find an Australian company that needs to hire someone for a skilled position. Large companies or multinationals will be in a better position for this kind of approach. Indeed, sponsorship represents a cost but above all a rather cumbersome administrative

procedure, which can slow down a some small companies. The principle is that the company wishing to sponsor a candidate need to prove that the profile concerned is rare on the Australian market.

The TSS visa allows the holder to live, work full time for his employer for the duration of the visa. This visa also allows you to travel to and from Australia for the duration of your visa. The TSS visa requires a job offer sponsored by an Australian employer and qualifications corresponding to the position.

There are three streams available under the TSS visa program:

- Short-term stream (2 years)
- Medium-term stream (4 years)

DO I NEED SPECIALISED SKILLS?

Yes, because the employer must prove that you are offering skills that he cannot find in the current Australian job market. Employer-sponsors come from all different sectors: sales, IT, finances, law, business marketing... The cases are evaluated one by one and depend on the state of the employment market in their sector and the professional skills required.

There are always some offers in many areas.

To be eligible for this visa, the position offered must appear on one of the lists of eligible professions, the STSOL or the MLTSSL. These lists are available on the government website : [CLICK HERE](#)

VISA FEES FOR THE APPLICANT


2 YEARS VISA : \$1455 for the main applicant and for each dependant 18 years and over.

4 YEARS VISA: \$3035 for the main applicant and for each dependant 18 years and over.


FOR THE EMPLOYER

If the employer already has sponsor status, they will simply need to submit a nomination request for your position. If he has never sponsored employees before, he will need to apply for the right to sponsor future people.

Be aware that this visa is tied to your job. In the event of loss of work, you have 60 days to find a job with another sponsor. During this time, your TSS visa will still be valid.

LAUNCH YOUR BUSINESS



There are various types of business visas available for non-citizens interested in engaging in business activities, investing, or starting a business in Australia. The most notable among these is the Business Innovation and Investment (Provisional) visa (subclass 188). This visa allows individuals to own and manage a business in Australia, conduct business and investment activities, or undertake entrepreneurial activities. Numerous other visa categories exist, such as the Permanent Business Innovation and Investment Visa (subclass 888), the Business Owner Visa (subclass 890), and the Business Talent Visa (subclass 132), among others, each designed

for distinct business and investment ventures. These visas come with unique eligibility criteria, including the necessity for an applicant to have previously held a provisional business visa, to have engaged in considerable business or investment operations within Australia, etc.

For former backpackers, it is therefore recommended to go through a Freelance status to start an activity. But this status does not allow you to obtain a work visa.

Housekeeping



Freshly graduated I left for Australia, my diploma not being valid there, I found a job in a hotel. The work is very versatile, I was able to do housekeeping, kitchen hand, receptionist, waitress.. that is to say the morning cleaning, the afternoon reception, and the evening waitress or kitchen assistant. The advantage of working in a hotel is to be able to work in several positions, so multiply the hours, we could do up to 85h/week paying 25 dollars an hour! Hotels are frequently looking for room cleaning so it makes it possible to find work quickly!

PATHWAYS TO PERMANENT RESIDENCY



After several WHV, it is quite common to choose Australia as your main residence. To obtain permanent residence in Australia, several options are possible.

VISAS OPTIONS

OPTION 1

You have sponsorship and would like to apply for residency via your employer.

Visa: Employer Nomination Scheme (Subclass 186) - Temporary Residence Transition stream

Conditions: To have been sponsored for at least 2 years in a full time job by the same employer.

OPTION 1 BIS

You have sponsorship and would like to apply for residency without involving your employer

Visa: Employer Nomination Scheme (Subclass 186) - Direct Entry Stream.

OPTION 2

Apply for residency sponsored by an Australian state.

Visa : Regional Sponsored Migration Scheme visa (Subclass 187)

OPTION 3

Apply for residency based on your professional skillset.

Visa: Skilled Independent Visa (Subclass 189)

Conditions: This visa is based on a points system awarded based on age, professional experience, qualifications, and level of English. Your occupation must be listed on the SOL (Skilled Occupation List). You will need to obtain a minimum of 60 points to be eligible.

OPTION 4

You would like to set up a business in Australia.

Visa: Business Talent (Permanent) visa (subclass 132)

Conditions: sponsorship from an Australian state or territory, proof of a successful experience in running a company (company worth of at least 400,000 AUD for candidate and partner combined), with annual turnover of

at least 3 million AUD in the last 2 to 4 years of business, with at least 1.5 million AUD in assets.

OPTION 5

You are in a relationship with an Australian resident or citizen.

Visa: Partner visa (subclasses 820 and 801)

Conditions: you must be able to prove that you have lived with the person for over a year, or that you have married the person to apply for this visa.

OPTION 6

Apply based on artistic, sporting, professional or research talent.

Visa: Distinguished Talent visa (subclass 124)

Conditions: you must be able to prove that you have exceptional talent in an area which will benefit Australia's economy or reputation, and you must meet certain health criteria..

OPTION 7

You are migrating to Australia on a student visa to study a course that leads to an occupation on the Skilled Occupation List (SOL)

Visa : 'Temporary Graduate visa' subclass 485 to gain experience in this field.

Two options available depending on whether you get an undergraduate or postgraduate diploma.

Conditions to obtain permanent residency are complex and are often changing due to new legislation. We recommend you contact a professional, for example an immigration agency, who will be able to advise you according to your situation.






